PARTICIPATORY WORKSHOP FREE ENTRY

Youths from regional island territories (Comores, Mayotte, Madagascar, Réunion and Seychelles), East Africa (Tanzania, Kenya and Mozambique), Europe and Mauritius will gather for three days to create, imagine, explore and question the possibilities of renewing the Africa-Europe dialogues.

The participants - committed citizens, artists, teachers, intellectuals, heads of public or civil society organisations, among others – will work on potential projects.

This program has been developed over the past months through an inclusive and participatory approach. It brought together about fifty youngsters for two discussion workshops. There were Mauritians, but also other nationalities, especially students and young professionals settled in Mauritius.







Four lines of debate emerged: Borderless arts and Culture, Here and/or there, A new approach to Africa-Europe borders, The island as a laboratory to reflect on the world.

Key personalities, namely Kantuta Quirós, filmmaker, curator and art theorist, Aliocha Wald Lasowski, musician, philosopher and lecturer, and Eirini Linardaki, artist and curator, will add to the discussions and creations.

An editorial committee has been set up to coordinate this 4th edition of Our Future Africa-Europe Dialogues and to guide the thinking of the young people invited to the co-construction days.





THE OCEAN AS NEW CENTRALITY

Questioning - Imagining

The ocean is a paradoxical object that separates as much as it connects. Looking at the continental in-between space as a new polarity means reversing the hierarchy between artificial and natural environments, between global and local, between continents. The exploratory work will therefore focus on this relationship with the ocean, and explore the protocols, tools and devices that would enable a new representation of the marine environment as a focal point. This is somehow, and in a hierarchical global system, a way of shifting the paradigm by looking rather from the perspective of geographical and natural objectivity rather than one of domination.

GLOBAL SOUTH YOUTH: MAKING OUR VOICES HEARD

Questioning - Creating

Young people often complain that they are not listened to. But what can we say about young people living in peripheral regions, in countries of the Global South or in small island states, with minimal visibility? How can you be heard when you are 18, 25 or 35 years old and live in these regions? What impact can your voice have? Besides being listened to, can it be heard in an endless stream of information... and of misinformation sometimes? Participants will first meet for a discussion session, during which they will share and confront their ideas and experiences, before taking part in an interactive public debate the following day.



BIOMES

Taste, see and hear the different biomes while wandering through them. The participants take active part in the experience, creating the flow between the different islands of the installation, becoming either a link or a barrier between two biomes. Through the movement they create, by discussing, hugging, shaking hands, and so on, they contribute to bridge the gap between borders, and to exchange across them.


These islands are complemented by sound and visual effects to produce a landscape that echoes what divides and unites us.




